About This Service...

Today we applied the late-winter application to your lawn. Cool-season (Fescue) lawns received a balanced fertilizer, broadleaf weed control and a pre-emergent herbicide for the control of annual grasses. This application will enhance the color of your lawn and aid in controlling weeds that may be present at this time. Crabgrass and other annual grasses will be controlled by the pre-emergent herbicide.

Warm-season grasses (Bermuda and Zoysia) received broadleaf weed control and a pre-emergent herbicide. This application won't aid in greening up the lawn, but it will provide nutrients in the soil to be available for the turf once it begins active growth. Weeds that may be present should begin to curl and fade in the next two to three weeks. The pre-emergent herbicide will help to prevent annual grasses from germinating.

Did you receive a tree and shrub application today?

The tree and shrub application today consisted of dormant oil and insecticide. This application utilizes dormant oils to help minimize the use of pesticides later in the year.

The oil actually smothers insects and their eggs. By using a sticking agent, dormant oils remain on the plants longer, thereby increasing their length of effectiveness. This helps to prevent damaging populations later in the season.

Lawns in Winter

Whatever your grass type, **King GREEN** has a specific program to keep it looking its best. And while each lawn is different, here's a general guide to how your lawn should look at this time of year:

Fescue

Your Fescue lawn probably doesn't have the vibrant color you saw through the fall. The fertilizer we applied today should begin to green it up and promote growth as soon as the soil temperature begins to rise. Fescue will often have a dull appearance at this time of year, and a quick mowing may help to green it up (even though it may not have growth).



Bermuda

Bermuda lawns should be brown and clean. If you see green patches in your lawn at this time of year, give us a call so we can diagnose and treat as needed. During late February or early March, you should scalp your warm-season grasses. Mow to 1" high so it will green up as quickly as possible.

Bermuda (as a weed)

Bermuda isn't commonly thought of as a weed. But if you see a clump of Bermuda coming up in the middle of your Fescue turf, we doubt you'd see it as anything except a weed. Bermuda is a warm-season grass and is easy to spot in the winter by appearing dormant in your green Fescue turf.

Although having grassy weeds in your lawn isn't a major disaster, it can certainly become a nuisance. Any small problems should be dug out immediately, taking care to remove all roots. For larger problems, Roundup® herbicides may be the only solution. Please contact your turf specialist for more information.

Fescue (as a weed)

Like Bermuda, Fescue isn't commonly thought of as a weed. But if you see a clump of Fescue coming up in the middle of your Bermuda or Zoysia turf, you'll see it as a weed. Even though you may have had new sod laid recently, Fescue seeds (as well as many other weed seeds) are blowing in the wind.

Preventing Fescue from gaining a foothold in your Bermuda or Zoysia lawn is the best plan of action. For larger problems, herbicides may be the only solution. However, when dealing with a grassy weed, herbicides will also affect your resident turf. If you feel that herbicides are needed, call us to schedule a consultation with your turf specialist.

Bermuda Grass isn't Made for the Shade

"Why does my Bermuda grass look so bad under that tree or next to my house?" We're often asked this question, and there are a couple of answers.

First of all, Bermuda grass needs a good six to eight hours of direct sunlight during the day to thrive. In shady areas (such as under trees or next to houses), it begins to thin out. As density is lost, weeds have an easier time gaining a foothold.

Also, competition for water and nutrients under trees makes it even more difficult for any turf grass to remain healthy. As trees grow and their canopies expand, so do their root systems. **King GREEN** works hard to keep your lawn looking its best. However, all of the fertilizer and lawn treatments in the world won't keep Bermuda grass healthy in heavily shaded areas.

One thing you can do to alleviate the problem is to try and get more sunlight to these areas. I seldom recommend removing trees for the sake of turf grass, but lower limbs can be removed. If you've done everything you can and your Bermuda grass is still struggling, it's time to stop fighting Mother Nature and make some changes. For example, bed lines can be extended further outward and more mulch can be put down. Installing shade-tolerant plant materials or ground covers is also a good alternative to trying to grow Bermuda grass in shady areas.

Cincinnati-style Chili

A Cincinnati favorite for decades, this chili has a taste all its own...not your conventional chili! Caution: can be addictive.

INGREDIENTS:

| 1 lb. ground sirloin | 1 Tbs. jalapenos (or to taste) |
| 1 – 14 oz. can of chili beans
(e.g. Chili Magic) | 2 tsp. granulated sugar |
| 1 – 14 oz. can of diced tomatoes | 1 Tbs. brown sugar |
| 1 large onion (finely diced) | ¼ tsp. cinnamon |
| 2 Tbs. cocoa (or cocoa mix) | 1 box of spaghetti |
| 2 Tbs. chili powder | Cheddar cheese (optional) |

Lightly brown ground sirloin and drain excess grease. Mix sirloin together with all ingredients (except spaghetti and cheese) and let simmer on stove top (or on medium setting of a crock pot) for 3 to 4 hours.

Pour chili over serving of spaghetti and add shredded cheddar cheese (optional) on top. Serves 4...**enjoy!**
